2. Faculty positions, Experimental Nuclear

Physics, Florida International University The Florida International University Department of Physics Invites applications for a tenure-track position, /open rank/, beginning August 2010 in experimental nuclear physics. The successful candidate is expected to conduct research at Jefferson Lab, preferably within the GlueX collaboration in Hall D, to have a strong commitment to teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, to supervising graduate students and to attracting external funding. Under a FIU/JLAB agreement this position carries 50% release time to carry out research at Jefferson Lab for the first four years of the appointment. The experimental nuclear physics group currently consists of four experimental physicists who are conducting research at Jefferson Lab in Halls A, B and C and in the future Hall D and are member of various research collaborations such as Hall A, CLAS, HKS and GlueX. The department (www.fiu.edu/physics <<http://www.fiu.edu/physics>>) has 21 faculty in theoretical and experimental groups in astronomy, biophysics, condensed matter, nuclear-particle-lattice QCD physics, physics education research, and quantum-optics. Interested candidates with a Ph.D. in experimental nuclear or particle physics and several years of experience should send their/ complete curriculum vitae, including a summary of research interests and the contact information for three references/, to Werner Boeglin, *Search Committee Chair, Department of Physics, Florida International University, 11200 SW 8th Street, Miami, FL 33199*. Application review will begin on January 15, 2010 and continue until the position is filled. Florida International University is an equal opportunity, equal access, affirmative action employer. 3. Carlos Ordoñez, NSHP Founding Member, named APS Fellow Carlos R. Ordonez, of the University of Houston was named Fellow of the American Physical Society under the Forum of International Physics, for contributions to the effective chiral langrangian theory of the nucleon-nucleon interaction and to conformal quantum mechanics and its applications, particularly to black-hole thermodynamics, and for extensive efforts toward developing science in Latin America.
